Early Head Start Kupukupu Child Development Center Completes Expansion with New Classrooms in Lahaina and Wailuku

As part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, MFSS received funding to increase services to Maui families in need of affordable childcare and child development services by opening two new classrooms.

On August 25, 2010, Pastor Albert Kamau provided the blessing over the newly opened classroom located at the Na Hale O Wainee Homeless Resource Center in Lahaina. The Lahaina classroom provides care for 8 children age 6 weeks through 3 years and is made possible through a partnership with Maui Economic Concerns of the Community, Inc. and the County of Maui.

In Wailuku, the addition of a new classroom to the existing center has allowed MFSS to provide care for 8 more children in the Central Maui area. The Starlight room recently

finished remodeling and is a safe and fun place for children to play and grow, preparing them to enter school ready to learn.

MFSS Continues to Support the Important Role of Men in our Community

MFSS is pleased to announce a new component of our Fatherhood Involvement Team, ManKine.

Developed by Roy DeLyon, coordinator of the Fatherhood Involvement Team. ManKine provides a support network that helps prevent sexual and domestic violence, as well as child abuse and neglect.

“Today’s males are lacking in the skills and tools that help us become productive men,” DeLyon says. “ManKine provides the training we need to be healthy—physically, mentally and spiritually—in order to create a safe environment for our families and community.”

In a society that teaches that men must be superheroes, DeLyon shares “When we fall short of that unrealistic ideal, we don’t know what to do. Often, we

end up with low self-esteem and anger, yet no one tells us how to deal with these emotions.”

“ManKine promotes strong self-esteem, to help us become who we want to be, not what the media tells us to be.” The organization helps all men, beginning with boys in middle- and high school, as well as men who are in prison or homeless shelters, recovering from substance abuse or dealing with anger issues.

Some of the strategies ManKine uses include:

- One-on-one role modeling and mentoring
- Life skills and fatherhood training
- Anger prevention and violence awareness education
- Physical fitness programs

ManKine offers its services free to participants and is funded by individual and corporate donations and staffed by one staff member and volunteers. Currently, the program is looking for space in Central Maui.

Bank of Hawaii

Bank of Hawaii has been very supportive of MFSS this year. Between January-June, Bank of Hawaii team members Curtis Tom, Deborah Dela Cruz, Nadine Akiona, and Ann Neizman facilitated Financial Literacy workshops as part of our SHEG grant. The SHEG program provided assistance to pay for childcare for 174 children, whose parents were required to attend a financial literacy course.

Bank of Hawaii also chose MFSS as a recipient of part of the funds raised by bank staff during the annual Visitor Industry Charity Walk. Bank of Hawaii

donated \$5000 to MFSS from the funds raised.

Between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010 the OARS team met with 1176 families at Maui Memorial Medical Center.

Today, Ruben is a happy and healthy 16 month old, attending the MFSS Early Head Start, Kupukupu Child Development Center while Ebony works to support her family as a hair dresser in Kihei. Tishri and Delon are both in school and doing well.

Meanwhile though, their housing situation is not what Ebony would like it to be. Currently homeless, Ebony and her little family have been staying at Family Life Center which provides a night shelter for women and children. Although they are only able to be at the shelter at night, it is a safe place for Ebony and the children to sleep, eat and shower.

We all know Maui is No Ka Oi but can be challenging when resources are limited. With the high cost of housing, limited jobs and the overall economy adding to our stress, families often find it difficult to meet basic needs. Ebony Prentice, a single mom of three, is one parent who has chosen to maintain a positive attitude and focus amidst those struggles.

Originally from Detroit Michigan, Ebony moved to Maui 15 years ago after spending three years in the Air Force. "My mom moved here so it was my only option" shares Ebony. Eventually Ebony had her first child Tishri, now 10. When Tishri was born, Ebony began receiving MFSS Healthy Start home visiting services, now Ohana Support Services. "I had no clue about what I was doing, I received good information and learned a lot about parenting" says Ebony. Three years later came Delon and in April of 2009 baby Ruben was born prematurely on Oahu. Upon return to Maui, Ebony decided to accept services through MFSS Healthy Start again, however, as the program was closed, Ebony remained on a waitlist and eventually began participating in the Early Head Start Home Based program.

Not having a stable roof over ones head would make most of us quite nervous and possibly even depressed, however Ebony, has found strength in her faith and quickly shares how it has helped her to remain focused on improving her situation, "God makes a way and he provides me all I need" she shares.

While Ebony works with the Veterans Administration to secure HUD assistance, she continues to work and focus on spending quality time with her children. She also donates her time to be on the MFSS Early Head Start Policy Council, helping to

improve the MFSS Early Head Start program for other parents.

Having three children Ebony has experienced the hard and joyful times as a parent, sharing that the hardest part of parenting is the discipline, "It's not quick and easy, you want to do it lovingly", and yet, "They love you unconditionally, no matter what". As a mom, she desires to see her children finish high school and even go to college. "I want them to follow their dreams and I want to be able to leave them something" she says. When asked what she would share with other parents Ebony quickly responds, "Get a relationship with God, it's not about us, these children don't belong to us, they belong to God and to the world. Take your job as a parent seriously and make everyday count. Lastly, watch what you do, children will do what they see, not what you say."

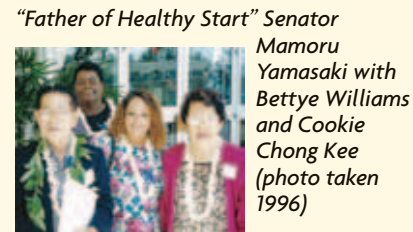

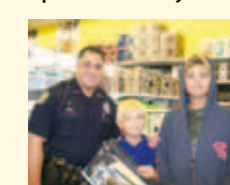

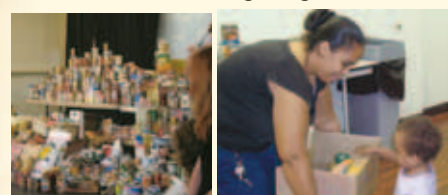

Results of Most Recent Financial Audit

- The audit for fiscal year 2010 (July 1, 2009 – June 30, 2010) is in progress.
- The most recent completed audit covered fiscal year 2009 (July 1, 2008-June 30, 2009) expressed an unqualified opinion with no findings.

Results of the Most Recent Federal Review

- Strength: The financial resources of the agency enabled the continuation of services for families who were receiving Healthy Start program, and provided EHS families enhanced services and alternative program options.
- Areas of Non-Compliance: child health and safety after diapering; policy group composition and formation; record-keeping systems for personnel; and duration of weekly home visits in home-based option.

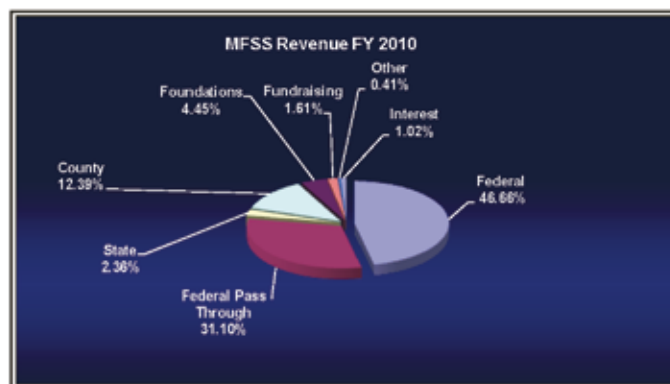
Agency's Efforts to Prepare Children For Kindergarten

- Assisting and supporting the family's and child's readiness to transition into preschool.
- Ensuring up-to-date well baby checks, immunizations, and dental check ups.
- Maintaining a healthy and safe environment for the entire family.

Information About Parent Involvement Activities

Parents participate in Policy Council, Parent Committees, Health Services Advisory Committee, and parent and child interaction home activities after classes or in between home visits to support children's development. We invite community partners as well as parents to present topics that families request.
