Greetings and best wishes from the Board of Directors! We're fast approaching our third decade of providing supportive services to help strengthen Maui Counties' families.

The need and interest for our many services not only exists, but will likely increase over time. I'm concluding this based on a few demographics.

There were 130-140 deliveries at Maui Memorial Medical Center per month 5 short years ago, and in 2006, demographics show that Maui

Memorial Medical Center averaged 146 deliveries per month.

In May of this year 170 deliveries were noted, and the average number of deliveries per month from May through October was 170.

## **Expanding Our Services....**


MFSS continues to grow as we reach more families. We look forward to increased opportunities to serve our community through the many services we offer to support families.



## **Healthy Start & Enhanced Healthy Start**

Maui Family Support Services has provided Healthy Start services on Maui and Lana'i since 1988, and in 2005 expanded services to Moloka'i. The Healthy Start Program is a community based program available to expecting parents and families with children up to age three years old. Services include home visiting, groups and other activities.

The program helps families to identify their strengths and

goals and select services designed to reduce stress, strengthen family functioning and promote optimal child development, health and safety. Information and assistance is also provided on additional community support, if needed.

Families participating in the program have access to the Child Development Services team and the Clinical Specialist. The program is available

to families with children up to 3 years old, or up to age 5 if a younger sibling is also in the program. Families may enroll during pregnancy or until the child is 1 year old. Children over 1 year may also be accepted based on needs and goals of the child and family.

The program is funded the State of Hawaii, Department of Health and community contributions.

Providing services throughout Maui County, Enhanced Healthy Start incorporates the Healthy Start services and also provides a Nurse and Mental Health Specialist.

The team provides families with supportive services and education regarding their child's health and development and family functioning. Eligibility extends from pregnancy until the child is three year old.

# Fatherhood Involvement

Promoting male involvement in the lives of their keiki, the Fatherhood Involvement Program provides group presentations and activities to Fathers and male caregivers of all ages, with children of all ages, or to expectant fathers.

Services provide one on one and group support, and information on healthy relationships, communications skills, increasing positive peer relations, parenting, child development, pregnancy prevention and sexually transmitted infections (STI's). Services are free, confidential and voluntary.

### **Early Identification Team**

Early Identification Team members speak to all new parents at Maui Memorial Medical Center, as well as any interested expectant parents. On Moloka'i our EID team members interview expectant mothers at the Moloka'i Women's Health Center. First time parents are given a copy of "Keiki O Hawaii",

which contains support information for new parents. Interviewed parents are asked questions to assess the family's strengths, goals, needs and concerns. Parents voluntarily accept MFSS services. The team also accepts referrals from individuals, physicians and other professionals. This program is funded by the

state of Hawaii, Department of Health.

# Child Development Specialists

The Child Development Specialists (CDS) team work closely with the Healthy Start team. The CDS team conduct training for the staff, aiding them in introducing parents to the stages of development, skills for observing baby's growth and learning, games and activities that encourage a child's mental and physical progress.

The CDS team conduct monthly Family Day events with a meal and activities for the children, and opportunities for caregivers to meet and spend time with other families with young children.

#### **Ohana Circle**

Ohana Circle provides
Healthy Start parents a place
where their ideas to enhance
and improve the program and
family life come to fruition.
The Circle meets once a
month with free refreshments. Parents create a
friendly environment of mutual self-help, support and
empowerment.

Activities have included Scrap-Booking, Art Class, Baby Massage, Salsa Dance and Lei Making. A quarterly Free Swap is also held, where families can browse thru and take, gently-used or new toys, books, DVD's, videos, car seats, strollers, etc., as well as adult clothing and household goods.

## **Early Head Start**

Early Head Start offers services for infants and toddlers through home-based and center-based options which are family oriented and family driven.

#### **EHS Home-Based**

The Home-Based option offers weekly home visits and twice monthly group activities to support families and children. Prenatal services are provided to expectant mothers and fathers, promoting healthy pregnancies and supportive postpartum care for the parent and child. The program helps the families to connect with services they may not otherwise access. With continuous enrollment, the EHS Home-Based option is open to

income eligible, pregnant women and families with children up to age thirty-six months, including children with special needs.

## EHS Child Development Program

The Center-Based, Kupukupu Program offers a child Development and Care Center and playground. "Kupukupu" means "surge forth and grow, such as a young fern". The Kupukupu Program is offered for incomeligible children six weeks to age thirty-six months, whose parents are working or going to school.

The Kupukupu Program is par-

tially funded through an Early Head Start Grant. MFSS thanks the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation which has provided a \$100,000 Endowment Fund for maintenance and repair of the Child Development Center building.

The Early Head Start program is funded primarily by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and families. The program has also received funding from the County of Maui, State of Hawaii Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Harry and Jeanette Weinberg foundation, Maui United Way, Hotel Industry Funds and community contributions.

## **Lanai Perinatal Support Services**

Available to all pregnant women on the island of Lana'i, the Lana'i Perinatal Program provides perinatal in-home support services.

The program offers confidential pregnancy testing, regular prenatal care consultations and birth planning. Services also include education on perinatal nutrition and oral health care.

The program works closely with the Lana'i Family Health Center's medical team and coordinates services with other MFSS programs and community agencies as needed.

### **Teen Voices, Best Choices**

Providing group presentations for youth ages 11 to 19, Teen Voices addresses relevant teen issues, through group presentations to school health classes, GRADS classes, after school programs, youth groups and other service programs.

Groups are also held by Teen Voices at the MFSS office, or excursions to other locations, such as the beach, and include snacks and great information! Topics include early childhood development and parenting skills, healthy relationships, communication skills, increasing positive peer relations and influences, promoting healthy lifestyle choices and reproductive health information for prevention of pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections (STI's).

## **Good Beginning Alliance**

Good Beginnings, in conjunction with Maui County's Early Childhood Resource Coordinator, works to provide a coordinated, early care and education system for young children, birth to age 8 years.

Good Beginnings is guided by a comprehensive plan under the leadership of the Good Beginnings Community Council. The Council includes fifteen members who represent various Maui programs that work with families of young children.

In addition to phone intake, counseling and referrals, Good Beginnings operates a child care subsidy program for families who may not qualify for other child care assistance programs due to income limits.

Good Beginnings also sponsors a family education program at Makawao School, serving infants, toddlers, preschoolers and their parents. The Program also collaborates with the Department of Education to provide Summer Transition to Kindergarten classes for children who have had little or no preschool experience.


